A MESSAGE FROM TIM LARDY 2026 BOD PRESIDENT

Thank you to all for taking part in the Survey.

There were 468 ballots submitted, which is about 48% of the community.

This survey provided valuable information for the Board to decide which projects the community would like the Board to pursue, if any. Please remember that CIF funds cannot be used to pay for operating costs.

The results are as follows:

The full survey results, including the write-in comments, are available at the front desk for those that would like to see them.

The next step in this process is for the Board to decide if we should pursue any of these projects.

If the Board decides to pursue a project, **Town Hall Meetings** will be set up to provide the detailed information of costs

(implementation, maintenance, and reserve requirements), as well as schedule.

A community vote would then be held to gain approval for the project.

No funding will be allocated or spent without community approval via an official vote.

I have initiated conversations with CRCA to determine if there are areas of cooperation that would be beneficial to both HOA's.

While I do not expect anything major to come out of this, I do expect, and will be working towards, a cooperative relationship.

More to come on this.

We would like to take a moment to remind our Sunflower residents to please fill out an **ARC Application** before making any changes to your home that are visible from the street as follows:

"No exterior alteration, addition, or renovation to any Dwelling Unit, no modifications to the interior of covered patios or porches, and no landscaping, walls or fences will be allowed on any Lot, without application to, and written approval by, the Architectural Review Committee. Each Owner is responsible for removing or otherwise correcting, at its expense, non-complying and/or unapproved improvements. In the event of a resale, property shall be brought into conformance with Sunflower Design Guidelines"

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE INITIATIVES

The Tree and Shrub Replacements for 2025 have been completed. Each member of the Committee presented their recommendations for a greater variety in trees and shrubs. The budget for the program fiscal year 2026 is \$15,000. We are mapping out the suggested plants to be presented at the February meeting to submit for the RFP. It is intended to finalize the plan by March's meeting.

Ongoing discussions involve three issues:

- ~ Irrigation system replacement in the main wash
- ~ Gravel replenishment
- ~ The March tree planting

The BOD has approved funding of the irrigation system work and is awaiting the completion of the RFP Process. The estimates for the gravel work have yet to be received as well. It has been discussed that best practices suggest doing the irrigation system first, then gravel work, and finally tree planting.

Some concerns have been raised by residents concerning the condition of old and newly-planted trees, that some of these look as though they have died. **AAA Landscape**, our contracted service provider, has inspected these trees and by scraping a bit of the bark away, one can see the periderm showing green, indicating a living specimen. Leaf browning may be caused by transplanting shock or simply the change of weather conditions. The irrigation system will be inspected to ensure proper watering.

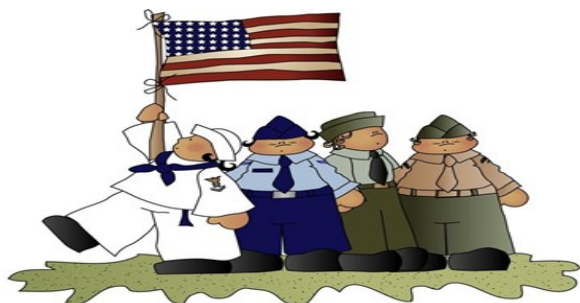
More events to look forward to later on around

GARY HAYDEN: A LIFE OF SERVICE, LEADERSHIP AND LASTING IMPACT

Airman First Class

Gary Hayden served in both the Nebraska Air National Guard and the Air Force Reserve, beginning a journey of service that helped shape his distinguished civilian career. In 1958, while living in Lincoln, Nebraska, **Gary** had recently completed college and was working summers for the railroad when he received his draft notice. Like many young men of his era, he chose to enlist in the branch of service that best aligned with his goals, joining the Nebraska Air National Guard that same year.



Gary completed Basic Training at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas. His training experience was notably shaped by a unique class cohort composed largely of college graduates or near-graduates. Recognizing this, their drill instructor took a measured and respectful approach that left a lasting impression. For summer duty, **Gary** served at Alpena, Michigan, working in communications where his responsibilities included maintaining telephone systems and teletype operations. He later transferred to the Air Base in Ottumwa, Iowa.

After his military service, **Gary** pursued a career in education, earning his Ph.D. in Special Education. His professional path took him to leadership roles in Iowa and Minnesota, including two superintendent positions, and lead of an area-education agency. He guided school districts with integrity and compassion.

One moment in his career remains especially memorable. While walking a school hallway, **Gary** encountered a young student leaving class in distress, declaring she was quitting school due to conflict with an administrator. **Gary** listened, calmed her, and encouraged her to return to class. Years later, at graduation, she sought him out to thank him for his guidance, testament to the quiet impact of steady leadership.

Reflecting on his journey, **Gary** credits the military with providing discipline, direction, and career opportunities. He continues to recommend service as a meaningful path for young people seeking purpose and growth.

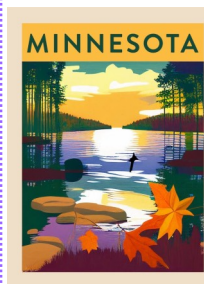

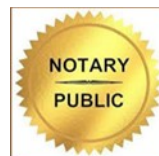

A Few Valentines' Day Facts You May Not Know

Does Valentine's Day have pagan origins? There was a mid-February fertility festival in ancient Rome called **Lupercalia**, which some believe was a forerunner to Valentine's Day. This feast of debauchery involved a ritual where an order of Roman priests ran naked through the streets, "gently slapping" women with the blood-soaked hides of sacrificed animals (yes, really), which they believed promoted fertility.

Where does the name Valentine come from? The holiday is aptly named after Saint Valentine, but who exactly was he? Valentine is likely based on a combination of 'two Valentines' who were executed on February 14th in different years by a 3rd Century Roman Emperor. The Catholic Church might have established St. Valentine's Day to honor these two martyrs. Legend says that one of these men, **Saint Valentine of Terni**, had officiated weddings for Roman soldiers in secret, going against the emperor's wishes, making him seen to some as a proponent of love.

So, what part does **Cupid** (or **Eros**) play on Valentine's Day? **Cupid**—that winged baby boy often seen on Valentine's Day cards and paraphernalia—is another symbol of this love-filled holiday, and it's easy to understand why. In Roman mythology, **Cupid** was the son of Venus, Goddess of Love and Beauty. He was known for shooting golden arrows at both Gods and humans, causing them to fall instantly in love with one another. In Greek lore, **Cupid** is known as **Eros** & was said to be a handsome immortal who played with the emotions of Gods and men, using golden arrows to incite love. While it's unclear exactly *when* **Cupid** or **Eros** was brought into the Valentine's Day story, it's certainly clear *why*. It wasn't until the Hellenistic Period that he began to be portrayed as the mischievous, child he would become on Valentine's Day cards.

Moving into more modern times, Americans probably began exchanging hand-made valentines in the early 1700s. By the middle of the 18th Century, it was common for friends and lovers of all social classes to exchange small tokens of affection or handwritten notes. In the 1840s, **Esther A. Howland** began selling the first mass-produced valentines in America. Known as the "Mother of the Valentine," she made elaborate creations with real lace, ribbons and colorful pictures. By 1900, printed cards began to replace written letters, as printing technology improved; and ready-made cards became an easy way to express emotions in a time when direct expression of one's feelings was discouraged. Cheaper postage rates also contributed to this increase.

Today, according to Hallmark, an estimated 145 million Valentine's Day cards are sent each year, making Valentine's Day the second largest card-sending holiday of the year — after Christmas.

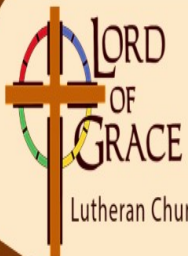
