A MESSAGE FROM THE 2024 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Fellow Sunflower Residents:

It's hard to believe, but we are at the halfway point in our Sunflower fiscal year when the Board's focus turns to the **Annual Board Election**. There will be three (3) open Board positions on the ballot this year, and the Board will be recruiting residents to fill those positions.



A good Board is made up of residents from a variety of backgrounds. Our past Boards have included residents with careers in teaching, law enforcement, construction trades, social work, homemaking, real estate, and finance, etc. The most important attribute for a Board member is the willingness to devote time and energy toward advancing issues that are in the best interest of the entire Sunflower Community.

Sunflower employs a professional management company that does most of the work required to run our Homeowner's Association. They take care of administrative tasks, dues collection, financial transactions and reporting, homeowner communication, staffing and human resources, and vendor management. The company also assists the Board with budget preparation and covenant enforcement.

Serving as a Board member will take up some of your time. Board meetings are held once a month, and Board responsibilities include acting as a liaison to one or more committees. A Board member can expect to devote 10-12 hours per month to Board business, perhaps more, depending on your level of involvement.

If you have any questions or would like to know more about serving on the Board, the Election Committee will host a <u>Board Information Panel on June 29th from</u> <u>9:00 to 10:00 a.m. in the Fiesta Room</u>. Present and former Board members will share their experiences as Board members, and answer questions. You are also welcome to contact any member of the current Board at any time.

We hope you will seriously consider becoming a candidate for a seat on the Sunflower Board of Directors.



AD HOC/SPORTS COURT COMMITTEE

The *Ad Hoc/Sport Court Committee* continues to meet monthly to provide input to the Board regarding community sport court needs. We recently expanded our charter to include the potential modification of existing courts. We also painted Pop Tennis lines on Courts 1 & 2.

We are reviewing options to achieve maximum utilization from the existing courts, as well as options for new courts. The Committee has evaluated usage and wait times for Pop Tennis, Pickleball and Tennis. We researched similar communities and met with local realtors to understand current and future needs. We put together a presentation of Past, Present and Future Needs, with data showing the need for more courts in Sunflower.

PRAC By Tom Howlin



PRAC is now on hiatus until October because many of our members are snowbirds and we often do not have a quorum during the summer months. We will, however, have a sub-committee working with the Reserve Study as it is updated for the year.

In leaving for the summer, I would like to leave you with a short and simple lesson on <u>how reserves work</u>. We are always talking about the reserve percentage which is currently at 87% and yet our goals is 100%, so where is the disconnect?

If we bought an item for \$10 with a 10-year life span, we would put into the piggybank \$1.00 each year. At the end of year 5, we would have \$5. If we have the \$5, we are 100% reserved as of that period in the life of the asset. If we only have \$3, then we are only 60% reserved. So, theoretically, if we are putting away the \$1 each year, we should always be 100% reserved relative to the lifespan of the asset.

So, why are we only at 87%? The reasons are many, but generally, it's either spending more than anticipated to replace an asset (like the pool and sport courts), an asset wearing out before the projected time (like pool pumps

in Arizona) or unexpected large jumps in inflation. Three years ago, we were reserved at 92% and lost 20% to inflation, Covid, supply chain and labor shortages. By policy, we must maintain a minimum of 70%; and because the community approved a retro-active disbursement from CIF, we are still in excellent shape and well above that minimum.

Conservative management of the Reserve Account is critical to a financially-stable community like *Sunflower*. That management comes about as a cooperative effort between *PRAC*, our professional reserve company (*ARI*), the community manager, the Board and the Finance Committee.

"It is the responsibility of the individual homeowner to provide and maintain full landscaping in all front, side and back yards according to the Design Guidelines" Design Guidelines Paragraph B, p. 5.

Compliance drive-throughs occur once a month by Management to check for any violations. The first violation letter is a <u>courtesy letter</u>, which gives the homeowner 30 days to bring the property into compliance. Once the property is in compliance, please inform the Village Center, and the violation will be closed out and removed from that address.

The second violation letter, if the situation is not resolved, <u>has a fine of \$100</u>. The third violation letter goes up to <u>\$200</u>.

Life in the Nations of the Balkan Peninsula


The Balkan states (the former Yugoslavia) plus Albania are a beautiful part of the world with a long, sometimes difficult history.

Airman First Class Edmond Schaefer

Edmond Schaefer, an Airman First Class, enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1962, embarking on a journey marked by significant historical events and personal growth. His service coincided with a tumultuous period in American history, including the tragic assassination of President John F. Kennedy.



Following basic training at
Lackland AFB in San Antonio, TX, *Schaefer* received specialized training in data processing at Wichita Falls, TX. His military journey began at Roswell, NM, where he witnessed the intense atmosphere during the Bay of Pigs crisis, with all B52s taking off to provide support. A pivotal moment in Schaefer's service came with his assignment to Wheelus AFB in Tripoli, Libya. He served there for two years and chose to extend his service for an additional six months. The experience of serving overseas undoubtedly broadened his perspective and shaped his character.

After his time in Tripoli, *Schaefer* was stationed at Charleston, SC, where he made the decision to leave the Air Force. Transitioning into civilian life, he ventured into the machine tool business before finding success in international marketing. Reflecting on his military service, Schaefer shared a poignant quote: "Four years in the Air Force prepared me to take advantage of ...open doors and created opportunities..." His time in the Air Force not only instilled discipline and skills but also fostered a mindset of seizing opportunities and overcoming challenges.

Schaefer's story exemplifies the transformative power of military service and the doors it can open for personal and professional growth. From his beginnings as an Airman First Class to his successful ventures in the civilian world, Schaefer's journey is a testament to the resilience and adaptability cultivated through military experience.

From the Sunflower Board of Directors:

<u>Topic</u>: Bicycles, Pedestrians, Bike Lanes, Sidewalks and Paths

"Bicycle riders have rights too..."

To avoid conflicts and increase the overall safety of residents, the Board of Directors has asked residents to **avoid riding bicycles on sidewalks and paths within Sunflower**. One reason for the Board's request is that dedicated bike lanes are available to bicycles on both sides of Sunflower Park Road.

Just as pedestrians have priority on the sidewalks and paths, cyclists should have priority in the use of the bike lanes. The Board asks residents to recognize that the bike lanes are meant for cyclists and not pedestrians. A conflict in the bike lane between a cyclist and a pedestrian presents the same safety issues as a bike on the sidewalk. If that conflict forces the cyclist out into the road when a vehicle is passing, the result could be a vehicle/bicycle collision with dire results.

If you are a pedestrian, please do not use the bike lanes as if they were a sidewalk or path. Please be aware of our cycling residents and limit your time in the bike lanes by crossing them perpendicular to the flow of traffic on the street and sidewalk.

May: Get to know your local law enforcement officers.


Attend community meetings and events where you can meet and talk to police officers. This will help you build a relationship with law enforcement and make it easier to report suspicious activity.



PRIMAVERA FOUNDATION

Last month when I was dropping off donations from Sunflower, one of the employees was so excited to see all the reusable canvas bags donated. That's when I found out how those bags are used in Tucson's new mobile shower trailer.



It offers warm showers for free, to the homeless and others going through a tough time. The five-person mobile shower trailer moves around town daily, to help underserved communities. The shower trailer, includes five showers, including an ADA-compliant shower room. Towels, body wash, conditioner and shampoo are provided, along with a clean pair of underwear in the bags. Individuals are able to utilize the shower for 15 minutes. The trailer also carries men and women's clothing.

Zion Alderette, 32, a regular volunteer with the program, was unsheltered for around a year and a half in his late 20s. During that time, he went three months without taking a shower during Tucson's scorching summer heat. He says a resource like the shower trailer is a "blessing" and can be "life-changing" for people. "When I wasn't able to shower, I tried to go to the courthouse to file my divorce and I wasn't even allowed to go into the courthouse. The guards said I couldn't go in" he says.

The official *Mother's Day* holiday arose in the 1900s as a result of the efforts of *Anna Jarvis*, daughter of Ann Reeves Jarvis. Following her mother's 1905 death, *Anna Jarvis* conceived of *Mother's Day* as a way of honoring the sacrifices mothers made for their children. After gaining financial backing from a Philadelphia department store owner named *John Wanamaker* in May 1908, she organized the first official *Mother's Day* celebration at a Methodist church in Grafton, WV, and it became an official U.S. holiday in 1914. Today, it is a holiday honoring motherhood that is observed in different forms throughout the world.

MOTHER'S DAY AROUND THE WORLD

While versions of *Mother's Day* are celebrated worldwide, traditions vary depending on the country. In Thailand, for example, *Mother's Day* is always celebrated in August on the birthday of the current Queen, *Sirikit*.

Another alternate observance of *Mother's Day* can be found in Ethiopia, where families gather each Fall to sing songs and eat a large feast as part of Antrosht, a multi-day celebration honoring motherhood.

In the United States, *Mother's Day 2024 falls on Sunday, May 12th* and continues to be celebrated by presenting mothers and other women with gifts and flowers. It has become one of the biggest holidays for consumer spending. Families also celebrate by giving mothers a day off from activities like cooking or other household chores.






