





FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

In October, the *Finance Committee* will be reviewing Sunflower's September Financial Reports. This information covers the last month of the fiscal year's income and expenses (October 2024-September 2025). October 1st starts the new fiscal year.

The *Finance Committee* looks forward to this review as the September financial reports provide the final information for the year and indicate how well the Community Manager and Board stayed within the 2024-2025 Budget. A Surplus is expected in this review due to less staffing, partially due to shortness in staff and being closed on Sundays and less storm damage than anticipated.

The Finance meeting to cover this information will be held on October 21st @ 1:30 p.m. in the Conference Room; and Sunflower members interested in the final figures are encouraged to attend this meeting. There may be some figures changed once the Annual Financial Audit is completed by the CPA firm by March of 2026. Currently, the Finance Committee does not foresee any major changes to the financials.

The *Finance Committee* currently has six members and has room for three more. Most of the current members have been on the committee at least three years, have a good working knowledge of Sunflower's financials and are available to assist new members in this area.

ANDSCAPE COMMITTEE By Charlie Barlow

Trees and Shrub Replacement Program: The Tree and Shrub replacements for 2025 have begun. A new survey for 2026 replacement areas along Sunflower Park Drive and Coachline will be done in October. The budget for the program fiscal year 2026 is \$15,000. Residents are invited to support this program by offering donations for additional trees. Irrigation Issues in the Community: AAA

Landscaping is working to resolve leaks in the irrigation system, progressing from one area at a time to the next, as best to respond to the multitude of reports by the residents of leaks. Leaks are exacerbated by javelinas digging in the leaking areas to create their beloved mud baths. AAA will be replacing plants that did not survive the summer in the turf removal areas. There is no cost for this since the planting is under warranty.

Members of the Committee will be volunteering to paint a mural on the walls of the trash receptable enclosures as weather conditions permit. Thank you, Lois Croly & all!

Granite Replenishment: An RFP response was presented by AAA for replenishing granite along the wash walkways. Due to budget restraints, funds are available for only a portion of the work, taken from both the fiscal years 2025 and 2026. The Committee will work with the Board to allocate money from the Reserve Fund to complete the project.

GORDON BARRON: A LIFE OF SERVICE AND ADVENTURE

Gordon Barron, an E5 Petty Officer Second Class in the U.S. Navy, grew up in California. On September 9, 1965, he enlisted, eager to see the world. After completing basic training, he was assigned to the USS Galveston (CLG-93) for six months while awaiting Radioman training. Upon completing his training, he was sent to Naval Air Station Adak, Alaska for 12 months in ground



support for tracking Russian Submarines. He was then assigned to the USS Annapolis (AGMR-1), sitting off the coast of Vietnam, allowing ground troops to communicate with their command centers, serving for 18 months.

During his time in the Navy, *Gordon* experienced many unforgettable moments, but none stood out more than crossing the equator. On his first crossing, he was considered a "Polywog," subjected to the Navy's time-honored initiation—a wild and unforgettable experience. However, by his second crossing, he earned the title of "Shellback," allowing him to take part in initiating the next group of Polywogs.

Gordon's service took him around the world, from San Diego, California, to the Aleutian Islands, then on to Africa, the Mediterranean, and Australia, ending up in Italy. With an early out in hand, he returned to Philadelphia, when the Navy shared that they had different plans for this Radioman - yep, Shore Patrol for his final 90 days. After completing his service in September 1969, he requested to be discharged in Philadelphia—far from home. With his travel pay in hand, he hitchhiked across the country back to California.

His love for travel didn't end with his Navy days. Shortly after returning home, he bought a 1965 GTO and hit the road again, visiting old Navy friends across the country. Eventually, *Gordon* found his calling in the trucking industry, spending 25 years as a manager of trucking operations, after which time he leased a truck and drove coast to coast and Canada for the last 5 years. From his Navy adventures to his lifelong love of the open road, *Gordon Barron's* life has been defined by exploration, camaraderie, and an enduring sense of adventure.



After losing her housing in 2021, *Tracy* found herself hungry and without hope. She endured the harsh desert climate, struggling to survive on the streets of Tucson for nearly four years.

In November 2024, *Tracy* joined the **Primavera Foundation's Homeless Intervention & Prevention**(HIP) **Program**, where she gained access to mail services, hygiene products & resources. About a month later, a housing voucher was available. The challenge was locating her without a current address or cell phone. *Tracy*'s case manager provided a photo to **Primavera's Mobile Outreach Team**. The team searched the streets, encampments, bus stops, tunnels, & parks. They left messages at locations where she was known to frequent. After weeks of effort, the outreach team received a tip & contact was finally established.

As of January 7, 2025, *Tracy* & her dog, Rockett were housed & *Tracy* has secured a part-time job. *Tracy* sent the following text message to her Case Manager: "I got a job and I wanted to share with you that it feels good to get back into life again. I feel renewed, full of energy and ready to live my life again sober and happy, and be a huge part of my children's life again. I could not even begin to tell you how appreciative and thankful for all you and Primavera have done for me There are no words that could explain how you guys strive to make this happen, and [your] belief in me... has made me feel whole again.... Now I expect better for myself, and from myself, and it feels amazing to have that drive again."






