LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

Smartscape Renovation Project Approval!

In keeping with the goals of creating resilient, low-water-use landscapes, and sustainable irrigation & landscape maintenance, the Sunflower Community has now received final approval to proceed with the **Smartscape Project**.

The project will involve removing some of the lawn areas around the Village Center area, then adding plantings of desert, climate-friendly trees and plants. Installation of a new irrigation system will reduce consumption to 30% of the current water usage. The project required recommendation of a design and construction plan submitted by the Landscape Committee first to the Architectural Review Committee, then to the **Board of Directors**, then to the City of Marana, and finally, approval from

The Tucson Water Conservation Program.

That Program will provide a grant of \$72,000 toward the cost of the project of \$144,000. The balance will be provided by the

Reserve and Community Improvement Funds.

Tree Replacement Program

The Landscape Committee is undergoing a study of this Fall's planting of new trees in areas along Sunflower Parkway. Due to the cost of removal of a large tree in one of the utility easements, our budget for new trees has been reduced to allow for only ten trees this year.



They remind everyone that an ARC application is required for all modifications to the exterior of your house, landscaping in front or side yards, as well as any wall additions/updates, even if wall is in the back yard. After you receive an approval letter from ARC, pick up a "work in progress" sign once your project starts. The sign does not have to be picked up until the process starts. When complete, call the Village Center and we'll send out an ARC representative to review the work and pick up the sign. Please hang the sign somewhere visible from the road. Thank you.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

What you should know about Home Rental Policy

<u>9.01</u>: Should any Sunflower homeowner choose to rent their home, <u>Policy 9.01</u> covers requirements that <u>must be followed</u> per Sunflower's *CC&Rs (Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions)* Art XII, paragraph 12.5.

Not more than 5% (48 homes) of the total *Lots within Sunflower* can be leased at any one time. Only renting the entire home is allowed; and single room rental, such as a B&B, is not allowed. Currently there are under 30 homes rented.

Article XII, 12.5: "Failure to notify the Association of a rental/lease shall be subject to a penalty as set by the Board".

Some of the Important Requirements in this Policy and Per Appendix A which lists the various Service fees are:

- ~ "A Lot that is rented or leased by the owner must be for a period of at least 30 days"
- ~ The Owner's Property Rental Fee: \$40 per renter.
- ~ "At least 30 days prior to offering a Lot for rent, the owner is required to obtain authorization from the Manager by submitting a completed "Intent to Rent Form" available at the Village Center desk.
- If the Intent to Rent Form is approved by the manager, the <u>following forms</u> will be provided to an Authorized Owner or the Prospective Renter:
 - 1 Tenant/Renter Information Form
 - 2 Registration Form

- 3 Renter's Proximity Card (Renter Fee \$25/card)
- 4 Age Verification Form (verifying that at least one of the Renters is 55 years of age or older)
- 5 Waiver, Release and Assumption of Risk Agreement
- 6 Waiver of Liability
- 7 Copy of Exhibit "D" Use Restrictions (which must be provided by the Owner to the Renter)

If interested in renting out your home, be sure to read this Policy and contact the Sunflower Community Manager for any questions you may have.

Retired members of our community contributed over 200 cumulative-volunteer hours, showcasing their commitment to making Sunflower a better place to live.

Key projects included:

'No Bicycle' Signs on Walking Paths: Thanks to *Jim's* "DIGGING" tool, the installation was quick and effective.

<u>Parkway Center Lights</u>: Five teams now monitor specific sections quarterly, with creative repairs and replacement parts for over 600 lights.

<u>Masonry Wall Repair</u>: Lead mason, *John Siegel*, ensured repairs were seamless for the two areas that were repaired.

U.S. Marine Corporal Daniel D. Coulter: A Life of Service and Adventure

Born in 1941 in FonDuLac, Wisconsin, *Daniel D. Coulter* grew up with a strong sense of duty and adventure. His father served on the local draft board during the early 1950s as young men were being called to fight in Korea. Meanwhile, Dan excelled in sports, earning accolades in baseball, basketball, and football during high school.



His athletic talent even led to tryouts with the Chicago Cubs and Detroit Tigers.

After graduating in 1959, Dan and his friends visited the local post office, where a Marine recruiter convinced him to enlist. Dan joined the U.S. Marine Corps, serving four years. He went through boot camp in San Diego, then received Infantry Training Regiment (ITR) instruction at Camp Pendleton. With little money and a 30-day leave, Dan began hitchhiking across the country, collecting incredible stories along the way. including the legendary tale of getting from Wisconsin to Hawaii.

Dan was assigned to the 1st Air Naval Gunfire Liaison Company (ANGLICO), providing close air support to the 25th Army Division. Later, he returned to the mainland and joined an artillery battery at Camp Lejeune. After his military service, Dan explored various careers, from managing a tavern to trucking, before finding his niche in real estate. He and his wife, Wendy, owned and operated a successful brokerage.

Dan's community involvement is extensive. He held leadership roles in the VFW, American Legion, Vietnam Veterans of America, and the DAV. He also served as treasurer for his local Chamber of Commerce and his church. Dan and Wendy have four children. His son and two daughters live in the Chicago area his oldest daughter lives in Oregon. If you ever meet Dan, buy him a beer—he has plenty of unforgettable hitchhiking stories to share.


