

My HealtheVet on VA.gov Transition



The VA's patient portal, My HealtheVet, is moving to VA.gov. With the new My HealtheVet on VA.gov, Veterans will have a secure, single online location to manage their health care and other VA benefits and services.

Veterans are no longer able to sign in using My HealtheVet user ID and password. The two-remaining sign-in options will be Login.gov and ID.me. Login.gov offers streamlined setup and integration with other federal services like TSA Precheck and FEMA. ID.me provides additional verification methods, including video calls and can be used for military discounts.

Renovations

Mental Health Building 90 renovation project to convert the Agave clinic into a Patient Aligned Care Team (PACT)-compliant layout: The Mental Health Renovation project has completed the demolition of the Agave Clinic. The Renovation Construction is ongoing and is scheduled to be completed by 2026. The staff from the Agave Clinic have relocated to the Psychosocial Rehabilitation and Recovery Center (PRRC) Mental Health Clinic.

Emergency Department (ED) Renovations and

Expansion: The connection to the existing water main on the North end of the building has been completed. The project completed drilling the 32 caissons which is the beginning of the foundation of the new section of building.

Expand and Renovate Clinics Bldg. 80: The General Contractor has poured the landing for the 2nd floor and the South stairs and installed the new exterior staircase. Due to this construction, the east entrance of Building 80 is closed until December 2025. In the meantime, patients should use the west entrance by the Emergency Department. We understand this may be inconvenient, but it's necessary to ensure everyone's safety during the structural work.

Auditorium Stage Restoration: The installation of the exterior Rose Garden stage, drainage, door, and hardware has been completed. The Auditorium was open to use in July.

Veteran Health Care Information

WWII Veterans' new eligibility for VA Health Care

If you served in World War II and are not currently enrolled in VA health care, this recent legislation ensures that you are now eligible for VA health care. WWII is defined as the period beginning December 7, 1941, and ending December 31, 1946.

The Cleland-Dole Act was signed into law December 29, 2022. Section 101 of this law expands eligibility for VA care for Veterans of World War II.

Veterans Crisis Line Number

Dial 988, then Press 1- Veterans in crisis or those concerned about a Veteran can call to reach trained responders 24 hours a day, seven days a week to receive confidential crisis support.
